


Barcelona (1.620.300) **Granollers** (60.900)

- They include training actions for library professionals.

Subsidies for local projects Objectives of the call:

- Territorial development of the program.
- Identification and offer support to local open innovation initiatives.
- Consolidation of BiblioLab model.

300,000 € for projects finnancing

Biblioteques de Badalona (population: 217.700)

BiblioLab: Level of implementation

2016:

20 libraries programmed activities or took part in BiblioLab projects, covering a potential population of 1,021,559 inhabitants.

2017:

98 libraries programmed activities or took part in BiblioLab projects, covering a potential population of 2,519,025 inhabitants.

2018:

185 libraries and 10 mobile libraries programmed activities or took part in BiblioLab projects, covering a potential population of 5,227,822 inhabitants.
